As a reminder — don’t forget to pick up your pet poop and this is why:

- 1) Storm water carries pet waste and other pollutants directly into waterways.
- 2) Animal waste may contain harmful organisms such as Giardia, Salmonella and E. coli that can be transmitted to humans and other animals by ingesting contaminated water.
- 3) Roundworms and hookworms deposited by infected animals can live in the soil for long periods of time and be transmitted to other animals and humans.
- 4) It’s the Law!!! Many urban and suburban areas require you to pick up after your pet.
- 5) Fines and Fees can go from \$75.00 to \$500.00 as well as court cost!!!
